INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE EXAMINATIONS

First Year and Second Year

Arts, Science and Commerce Students

Duration of the B.A., B.Com. and B.Sc. programme will be of 3 years in the Semester pattern i.e. from Sem. I to Sem. VI. The degree will be awarded to a learner who successfully completes 120 credits of the programme in period of 3 to 6 years from the year of enrollment to semester I.

If a learner does not earn 120 credits in 12 semesters from the year of enrolment to semester I, he/she may at his/ her option transfer his/her performance in the existing/new program after establishing equivalence between old and new syllabus. Such a performance transfer will be decided by the Board of Studies / Ad-hoc Board / Ad hoc Committee of the concerned subject.

The admission to the program will be governed by the existing rules

The fees for transfer of credits or performance will be based on number of credits that a learner has to complete for award of the degree.

(e) A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester VI irrespective of number of heads of failure in the Semester V, However the learner shall pass each course of Semester III and Semeter IV in order to appear for Semester VI.

- d) Eligibility criteria for a learner, to be admitted in Semester V (Third year) of UG programs (aided and non-aided) in Facufties of Arts and Commerce is amended as follows,
- i) Shall have passed Semester I, II, III and IV in full **OR**
- **ii**) Shall have passed Semester I and II in full and secured ATKT in the Second year by failing in not more than Two Courses in each of Semester III and Semester IV. **OR**
- iii) Shall have Secured ATKT in First Year by failing in not more than Two Courses in each of Semester I and Semester II and have passed Semester III and Semester IV in full.

Eliqibility for Admission to Semester V (Third Year) of Under Graduate Programs (aided and non-aided) in the Faculty of Science is amended as follows:

Learner shall have passed Semester I, and Semester II in full and secured ATKT in Second Year by failing in for programs with 900 and above marks in not more than Three Courses in eanch Semester III and IV. For Programmes with less than 900 marks in not more than three courses with not more than total 200 marks in each of Semester III and IV

OR

Learner shall have passed Semester III and Semester IV in full and secured ATKT in first year by failing in for each Semester I and II. For programms with 900 and above marks in not more than Three Courses each of Semester I and II. For Programms with less than 900 marks in not more than three courses with not more than total 200 marks in each of Semester I and II.

- v) A learner shall be allowed to keep terms for Semester VI irrespective of grades obtained in each course of Semester V.
- vi) The result of Semester VI, shall be kept abeyance until the learner passes each of Semester I, Semester II, Semester III, Semester IV and Semester V in full.

ADDITIONAL EXAMINATION: INTERNAL ASSESSMENT:

Eligibility norms to appear for the additional class test or assignment or project for learners who remained absent:

- a. The learner must apply to the Head of the Institution giving the reason(s) for absence within 8 days of the conduct of the examination along with the necessary documents and testimonials.
- b. If the learner is absent for participation in Inter Collegiate events, State or National or International level events,

Training camp or coaching camp organized by authorized university or state or national or international bodies, NSS / NCC Events / Camps / cultural activities / sports activities / research festival or any other activities authenticated by the head of the institution, the head of the Institution shall generally grant permission to the learner to appear for the additional class test or assignment.

c. The Head of the Institution, on scrutiny of the documents and testimonials, may grant the permission to the learner to appear for the additional examination.

MODE OF CONDUCT OF SEMESTER END ADDITIONAL EXAMINATION

- a) There will be one additional examination for semester I, II, III and IV only for those who have failed or remained absent.
- b) The absent leaner will be allowed to appear for the examination by the head of the institution after following the necessary formalities subject to the reasons to the satisfaction of the head of the institution.
- c) This examination will be held 20 days after the declaration of results but not later than 40 days.

SEMESTER END EXAMINATIONS ELIGIBILITY TO APPEAR FOR ADDITIONAL SEMESTER END EXAMINATION:

A learner who does not appear i.e. remains absent in some or all the courses on medical grounds or for representing the college / university in sports, cultural activities, activities of NSS, NCC or sports training camps conducted by recognized bodies/ competent authorities or for any other reason which is considered valid under exceptional circumstances and to the satisfaction of the Principal or the Head of the Institute OR fails in some or all the subjects is eligible to appear for the additional examination.

- (3) A candidate who fails to pass an examination will be graced upto a maximum of 10 marks for the purpose of an exemption in a subjects; shall not exceed 5 per cent of the maximum marks allowed to the subject.
- (4) A candidate who is not graced under any of the conditions mentioned above will be graced by ten marks which will be added to the total.

- Provided further that this refund is concurrent with the rules and guideline of other professional statutory bodies appointed for admission for relevant courses.

N. B.: Admission granted shall be held invalid if full payment of necessary tuition fees and deposits is not made on the same day on which admission is granted.

- GENERAL RULES -

- 1. Students shall abide by the rules and regulations laid down for their discipline and development of the College.
- 2. Students must put in a minimum attendance of three

- fourths of the number at working days in a term to be eligible for the grant of a term as required by the H.S.C. Board/University of Mumbai. The arrangement of terms will be announced in the Notice Board. Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, Nav-Buddhist and other Backward Class and Economically Backward class students who have been granted free studentship will also be required to keep 75% attendance during each term in order to avail themselves of free studentships, in accordance with the rules for such awards.
- 3. Students should not be found loitering during College hours. While moving from one class to another students should keep to the left walk in a single file and observe silence. Students should also observe silence near Principal and Vice-Principal's Chambers, Staff Common Room, staircases and in the office.
- 4. Students shall be properly and neatly dressed within the College premises and will co-operate with the authorities of the College in keeping classrooms, premises, staircases and the office clean & neat.
- 5. As there is a College Canteen in the premises, students are expected not to patronize way side vendors or eat on the streets.
- 6. Students must not absent themselves from the College examination without the previous permission of the Principal.
- 7. Student must not smoke or use sun-glasses in the College premises and must not do anything inside or outside the College that will any way interfere with its orderly administration and discipline. Chewing Pan, Tobacco & use of Mobile phone etc. is strictly prohibited in the college premises.
- 8. Students are prohibited from organizing meeting entertainments and collecting money without the permission of the Principal.

- 9. No student will be allowed to take an active part in current politics or religion or imposes his/her views in anyone Academic atmosphere should be maintained.
- 10. No student shall communicate any information about any matter concerning the College to the Press. The Principal shall be happy to redress the grievances.
- 11. An Identity Card will be issued to every student admitted to the College. He must always wear the card with his photograph affixed to it and must present it for inspection whenever demanded by the College authorities.
- 12. Students receiving Government or College Scholarships or Free Studentship should note that they are arranged in the following conditions:
- (a) That the student is regular in attendance.
- (b) That the student shows sufficient progress in his studies.
- (c) That the student must not remain absent himself from the College examinations without the previous permission of the Principal.
- (d) That the student must not remain absent himself from the College examinations without the previous permission of the Principal.
- 13. Visitors to students are not allowed during College hours. If they desire to invite a friend to hear lecture, the previous permission of the Lecturer concerned must be obtained. Students themselves must not attend classes other than their own, without the previous permission at the Principal or the lecturer concerned.
- 14. Students are expected to take proper care of College property. Any wanton damage to the furniture, fitting, equipment or Library books will be looked upon as a breach of discipline and will be met with due punishment. On no account should library books be carried outside the Library. Students found doing so will be fined.
- 15. Demand slips for books pertaining to Science Section will have to be countersigned by the professors concerned.

This is essential for checking bonafide demands.

- 16. Students while in the Library will have to refrain from talking and indisciplinery behaviors, so as not to disturb others doing quite reading. Anyone found making noise will have to leave the Library immediately.
- 17. Students guilty or discourtesy to the Librarian or misbehavior in the library will be suspended from using the library.
- 18. A suggestion box is kept in the library. Students are requested to write down their suggestions for new books, additional copies etc. and all matters pertaining to the library. Name of the student, his roll number and division etc. are essential for future reference in the case if person interviews in the matter

Note : All these rules are admissible for only regular students. Ex-students are not allowed to enter and sit in the library without the written permission of the Principal.

RAILWAY CONCESSION TO BONAFIDE STUDENTS

Students up to 25 year are entitled to Railway concession according to existing rules persuant to a recent directive from the railway.

STATEMENT OF MARKS AT UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION

Statements of marks and passing certificates if received from the University on the dates of declaration of the results will be distributed to the students concerned on production of their Identity Cards between 09.30 a.m. and 10.00 a.m. in the College Office on working days. The statement of marks and passing certificates should be collected within three months from the dates of declaration of the results.

REFUND OF CAUTION MONEY

Application in the prescribed form for refund of the Caution Money must be submitted within two months of leaving the College, after which the amount of deposit will be forfeited.

ADMISSION

Students are advised to go through the Eligibility rules carefully. Only those who are eligible to take admission should fill in the College admission form. Students should note that they are taking admissions on their own responsibility.

FOR STUDENTS FROM OTHER COLLEGES AFFILIATED TO MUMBAI UNIVERSITY

A student coming from another College affiliated to the University of Mumbai is given provisional admission till the receipt of the Tansference Certificate from his previous College. The student must submit to the Principal of the College, an application in the prescribed form for such, transference Certificate along with the application for admission. His admission will NOT be final without the production of Transference Certificate and will be treated as cancelled in the event of his failure to produce the Transference Certificate before the end of term in which he seeks admission.

FOR STUDENTS FROM OTHER UNIVERSITIES

A student from any University, other than Mumbai is eligible for admission only after obtaining the Statement of provisional Eligibility from the Registrar of the University of Mumbai. Admission will be given to a student on the strength of provisional Eligibility statement of his eligibility from the Registrar, University of Mumbai. Pursuant to a directive from the University (vide circular No.E/C. 184 dated the 9th April, 1970) students who have obtained admission on the strength of the Provisional Statement of Eligibility will be required to submit the statement of marks passing, migration certificates to the College Office for forwarding the same to the University before the close of the first term

PENALTY FOR LATE PAYMENT

There will be penalty of Rs.l/- per day till 30 days after the due date of the payment of fees. A student failing to pay his fee (with penalty) within this period will be liable to have his name removed from the College Roll without notice.

Applications for admission to the various University Examinations & the dates of commencement of Examinations. The exact dates will be announced on the College Notice Board.

IDENTITY CARDS

A student on admission to the College has to keep with him an Identity Card (obtained from the Office) bearing his name, Roll No. Class. Division his/her signature and his/her photograph duly attested by the Principal. The Identity Card has to be produced on demand on the premise of the College. No student is eligible for using the Library or periodicals or for participating in the College Sports or activities of the various associations, unless he/she possesses the authorized Identity Cards. No student will be allowed to appear for any College or University examination without the Identity Card.

ISSUE OF CERTIFICATE AND STATEMENT OF MARKS OF COLLEGE EXAMINATIONS

Certificate (to be applied for in the prescribed form) regarding conduct, progress in studies etc. will be issued Rs. 10 to the students of the current academic year till the beginning of the next academic year. Certificates required by the past students who studied in the College within a period of five years prior to the date of the application will be issued on receipt of a fee Rs.10, while the fee for certificates for period beyond five years prior to the date of the application will be Rupees 20 Transference Certificates relating to a period of one term will be charged Rupees 100 per copy and for the period beyond five terms will be Rupees 100 per copy. Statement of marks relating to examinations held by the College will be issued on receipt of fee Rupees 25 per copy with a period of five years and beyond five years Rupees 25. The above certificates and statements of marks (also to be applied for in the prescribed form) will ordinarily be issued ten days after the receipt of the applications and the fees prescribed thereof. For urgent certificates, the fee will be double than the normal fee (within two days). Incomplete applications or applications without appropriate fee will not be attended to.

CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION

No application for cancellation on admission according to rules will be treated as valid without the production of either a stamped and signed receipt issued by the College office or an acknowledgment due receipt on a REGISTERED INLAND letter.

ADMISSION TO POST GRADUATE CLASSES USEFUL INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS

Admission to M.A.Part-I classes are given by the University Students are therefore. advised to fill in the prescribed forms of application (available from the University Office) and submit the same to the University on or before the last dates to be announced by the University in this behalf.

- 1. Students whose names have not been registered at a University examination even once during a period of five years following the keeping of their terms for the said examination will have to obtain the permission of the University before sent up for the examination. Applications in this behalf will have to be routed through the College.
- 2. Examinations hold good so long as candidates do not appear against in the respected subjects.
- 3. Applications for half the refund of the fees at University examination on account of inability to appear for the examination on medical grounds must reach the Principal of the College supported by medical certificates within three days of the commencement of an examination. Full refund is granted only when a candidate dies prior to the commencement of examination.
- 4. Students are hereby forewarned that their performance at the College examinations, tutorials and practical will be taken into considerations before recommending them for admission to University examinations. Students showing poor progress shall be detained.
- 5. No change in the subjects once selected will be permitted later on.
- 6. Employed students seeking admission to the Morning Session are required to produce certificate of gainful

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employment from their employer, if employed in Registered Companies, Statutory Bodies and Government Offices, in other cases, certificates of employment must be attested by Gazette Officers.

7. For reasons such as misconduct (within and without premises of the College) and non-payment of College dues, applications are likely to be withheld, despite satisfactory progress at the examination.
